### Conference venue

- from Frankfurt airport via Frankfurt main station by ICE-train (about two hours)

The conference takes place at the **Tiefenbrunn hospital**, a well-known psychotherapeutic and psychiatric hospital, founded in 1903, situated within a beautiful park with old stock of trees and streams, about 7 km from the centre of Göttingen.
