Invited plenaries and semi-plenaries will review the major issues facing researchers, and the innovative methodologies which are being developed within this context.

Euroqual's primary focus is the interdisciplinary exploration of methods and the translation of methodological innovation into research practice. Euroqual is supported by the European Science Foundation.

Papers falling within Euroqual's primary themes will be especially welcomed. These are:

- The collection and analysis of visual data
- Life-histories, biographies and archives
- The use of innovative information technologies for creating, analysing, and disseminating data
- The integration of spatial and network analysis into ethnographic and qualitative research
- The collection and analysis of narrative and discourse data
- The use of qualitative data for developing and evaluating evidence-based social policy and practice
- The use of multi-method research designs and strategies

Other themes include:

Text and Textual Analysis; Museums Heritage and Display; Performance and Embodiment; Visual Culture and Art; Discourse; Hermeneutics; CAQDAS, Digital Methods and HyperMedia; Time and Space; Material Culture; Ethics and Politics.
